**MINUTES**

***On a motion by Mark Pennink, seconded by Glenn Gurney, Council voted unanimous approval of the December minutes.***

**TREASURER'S REPORT**

Treasurer Vikki Trost reported General Fund Revenue for December was \$9,845.38. General Fund Expenses were \$117,657.29. Net Income was -\$107,811.91.

2020 General Fund Revenue exceeded the budget by \$74,869.29 and Expenditures came in under budget by \$75,546.11, indicating a pre-audit surplus of \$150,415.40. Police Car Reserve (\$12,500) and Public Works Reserve (\$54,600) transfers, when approved, will reduce this number.

Sewer Fund Revenue for December was \$97.00. Sewer Fund Expenses were \$19,954.92. Net Income was -\$19,857.92.

2020 Sewer Fund Revenue reflects an unfavorable budget variance in the amount of \$27,404.37 while Expenditures came in under budget by \$66,515.14, indicating a pre-audit surplus of \$39,110.77.

Today PLGIT paid .01%. PLGIT I-Class paid .09%.

**POLICE CHIEF’S REPORT**

Chief Steve Gray reported the following activity for December 2020:

On Tuesday December 8th at 3pm, Police took a delayed theft report at the Bryn Athyn Cathedral. Staff advised that on December 7th, they observed a female cut and remove branches from a bush that was located on the Cathedral grounds. Cathedral Staff provided police with the license plate of the vehicle driven by the offender. The Cathedral Staff did not want to press charges against the offender, however, at the request of Cathedral personnel, police issued a warning letter to the offender, including that a second offense would result in them being charged with theft.

On Thursday December 17th at 5:06am, police responded to investigate a vehicle accident which involved the vehicle striking a telephone pole in the area of Huntingdon Pike and Cathedral Road. Further investigation revealed that the driver, a 26-year-old male resident of Drexel Hill, was under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance. The driver refused to take a blood test and was charged with a refusal, which carries the same DUI penalties for drivers who test at the highest level of being under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance. Police were advised that State Parole was going to revoke the defendant’s parole and return him to prison for this incident.

On Sunday December 20th at 12:10am, police conducted a vehicle stop at Huntingdon Pike and Alnwick Road due to the registration showing that the driver of the vehicle was

under suspension. Further investigation revealed that the driver, a 25-year-old resident of Philadelphia, was in possession of marijuana, which he admitted to smoking while he was driving. The driver was also in possession of drug paraphernalia. Field Sobriety Tests were given to the driver who showed signs of impairment. The driver refused to take a blood test and was charged with a refusal, which carries the same DUI penalties for drivers who test at the highest level of being under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance.

On Monday December 21st at 10:27pm, a Bryn Athyn Police officer who was on his way to work observed an elderly male standing alongside the road in the 3000 block of Huntingdon Pike wearing all dark clothing in a dangerous and dark area of the highway. The off-duty officer called the on-duty Bryn Athyn officer who stated that he had just received a 911 call about the person. Upon arrival, the Officer was able to determine that the elderly male was the same who had walked away from Tabor House in Philadelphia, which is a nursing home. The male, who was suffering from dementia was transported by police back to the nursing home.

On Thursday December 24th at 3:06pm, police took a report of vandalism at the Bryn Athyn Cathedral which involved a broken window. A large rock was found near the broken window. The incident is currently under investigation.

### **FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT**

Chief Derek Zecher reported 386 Fire Calls during 2020, which is the second busiest year in the past fifteen years. Forty-three (43) of those calls were in the Borough. There were 979 transports to the hospital in 2020. There were 110 EMS Calls in the Borough last year. Santa Claus toured the Borough bringing Christmas cheer to residents.

Chief Zecher reported that all employees, who want to be, will be vaccinated with the Covid-19 Vaccine through Montgomery County by the end of January.

### **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT REPORT**

EM Coordinator Ken Schauder reported that the team met in December and will hold future meetings every other month. The next meeting will be held in February.

Trash Contract

Vikki Trost reported that the new 3-year trash contract began today. New contact information from Steve Woerner at Lower Moreland was received today.

Health Insurance

The new health insurance plan is running smoothly. We are receiving weekly reports of charges to the Health Reimbursement Account.

2021 Fee Schedule

The Fee Schedule should be updated each year. There are no changes to the Fee Schedule. Mr. Elsing commented that the Finance Committee will meet this month with representatives from Building Inspection Underwriters, Inc., who issue building permits for the Borough, to review permit fees.

**PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE**

Chairman Mark Pennink reported that there was one snow event in December which was handled easily by the snow crew. New DO NOT ENTER signs were installed at Quarry Road.

Mrs. Genzlinger reported that the second survey sent to Alden Road residents had a smaller response, about half were returned. These responses will be reviewed with Nick Rose this month.

**FINANCE COMMITTEE**

Chairman Duane Hyatt reported that the Finance Committee met in December. Mr. Hyatt reported that Bill Brown (EEMA) has prepared the new billing methodology but they were not received and reviewed in time to include in the 2021 rates ordinance. Mr. Hyatt noted that the sewer usage rates on the proposed Sewer Usage Rate Ordinance to be discussed this evening do balance the Budget, however, the proposed new methodology rates need to be reviewed because other income was not taken into consideration in the new calculation. Council will be asked to adopt an ordinance today with old rates; those rates will be amended by ordinance in February or March.

Mr. Hyatt reported that the Finance Committee discussed the Lease Agreement with the Academy of the New Church for the Borough Municipal Building. The Lease term was for thirty (30) years beginning January 1, 1991. The terms of the Lease state that after the thirty (30) year term, the Lease will renew indefinitely with a five (5) year

termination notice requirement. Mr. Hyatt (wearing his Academy hat) has been working with Ken Schauder and Lach Brown for several years on a new lease, noting that the Academy has no interest in giving the Borough a termination notice.

PUBLIC HEARING – ORDINANCE NO. 696

President Jeff Elsing opened the public hearing to discuss proposed Ordinance No. 696 setting the 2021 Tax Rates. Mr. Elsing read Section 1 aloud noting the Real Estate Tax Millage Rate, Earned Income Tax Rate and Local Services Tax Rate. The public hearing was opened to Council for discussion.

Mr. Hyatt noted that there is no increase proposed for Real Estate Tax, Earned Income Tax or Local Services Tax. Hearing no further comments or questions, the public hearing was opened to public comment.

Hearing no public comment, the public comment period was closed and the discussion sent back to the Council. Hearing no further comment by members of Council, the Public Hearing was closed.

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BRYN ATHYN FIXING THE TAX RATE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2021.**

**THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BRYN ATHYN HEREBY ENACTS AND ORDAINS:**

**SECTION 1**            **SUMMARY OF TAX REVENUE.**        *That a tax rate be and is hereby levied on all property within the said Borough subject to taxation for Borough purposes for the Fiscal Year 2021 as follows:*

- A.    *Tax Rate for General Borough Purposes, the sum of Ten and eight Hundred and Seventy-Six Thousandths (10.876) mills on each dollar of assessed valuation, making a total tax rate for all Borough purposes of Ten and Eight Hundred and Seventy-Six Thousandths (10.876) mills.*

- B. *That a tax at the rate of one percent (1%) on each dollar is hereby imposed on all earned income and net profits earned by residents of the Borough of Bryn Athyn and non-residents of the Borough of Bryn Athyn for work done or services performed or rendered in the Borough.*
- C. *That a Local Services Tax is imposed on all residents and non-residents employed in the Borough of Bryn Athyn in the amount of \$52.00.*

**SECTION 2** *That any ordinance or part of any ordinance, conflicting with this Ordinance be, and the same is hereby repealed, insofar as the same affects this ordinance.*

**SECTION 3** **SEVERABILITY.** *The provisions of this Ordinance are severable. If any sentence, clause or section of this Ordinance, for any reason, is declared to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, said unconstitutionality, illegality and invalidity shall not impair any of the remaining provisions or sections of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Borough Council that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentences, clauses, or sections not been included herein.*

*This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately.*

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF BRYN ATHYN SETTING SEWER RATES FOR THE FUNDING OF THE BOROUGH WASTEWATER TREATMENT SYSTEM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2021.**

*The Council of the Borough of Bryn Athyn does hereby ORDAIN as follows:*

- 1. The Borough does hereby set sewer rates for the funding of the operation and maintenance of the Borough Wastewater Treatment System.*

<i>Category 2 – Rate per 100 gallons of water used</i>	<i>\$1.06108</i>
<i>Category 3 – Rate per 100 gallons of water used</i>	<i>\$2.1280</i>
<i>Category 4 – Rate per 100 gallons of water used</i>	<i>\$2.1280</i>
